What is the DAAD

(German Academic Exchange Service)?

- Non-profit organization, mostly government funded
- A joint organization of German universities
- Promotes academic exchange and cooperation between Germany and abroad
- Offers scholarships and grants for studies and research in Germany
- Offers information and advice on all questions regarding study and research in Germany

Why choose Germany?

- German higher education enjoys excellent reputation worldwide
- State-of-the-art-facilities
- Very moderate or even no tuition fees
- Highly qualified teaching staff
- Research at the forefront of science
- International degree courses conducted in English



Can I study in English?

How much German do I need?

- More than 1,705 international degree programmes in English. Check at www.daad.de/idp
- Most (but not all) undergraduate programmes require German.
- International Master programmes completely in English.
- Many opportunities to achieve PhD in English.
- Nevertheless, it is highly recommended to take the opportunity to learn German.

What qualifications do I need?

- Bachelor's degree: STPM, A-Levels or International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma
- Master's degree: related Bachelor's degree
- PhD: related Master's degree
- TOEFL/ IELTS for programmes in English
- TestDaF/ DSH for programmes in German

How do I apply?

Application requirements and procedures vary depending on each university. Please check directly at the university's website.

How much does it cost?

- Most public German universities do not charge tuition fees.
- Living costs are around € 934 per month.

Are students allowed to work in Germany?

- Non-EU students are allowed to work up to 120 full days (or 240 half days) per year.
- After graduation, students can stay in Germany for up to 18 months to look for a job.
